Overview

The N2 Corracrin to Emyvale Road Improvement scheme started in May 2018. The works involve the realignment of 3.4km of the N2 National Primary Road. The works include the construction of a new widened carriageway, footpaths, cycleway, signage, road markings, public lighting, road drainage works, safety barriers, landscaping and accommodation works. The project represents a major investment in the road network and is funded by Transport Infrastructure Ireland. The construction works will take approximately 18 months to complete.

Progress update:

Site clearance - Works are ongoing with hedgerow and tree felling being undertaken on both sides of the road. Temporary and permanent fencing is being erected in tandem with the clearance works in order to secure access to lands.

Structures A Cattle underpass has been installed and will be completed in coming months.

Utilities - The Contractor is liaising with all the utility providers affected, ie ESB, EIR, Irish Water and the Tydavnet Group Water Scheme.

Roadworks and Drainage - The section of the southbound carriageway outside the church and school is the first area of roadworks that are being undertaken. Excavation and drainage is ongoing and it is hoped to have this area completed as soon as possible to reduce the interface with the children and parents.

Upon completion of the section of southbound carriageway, works will transfer to the northbound carriageway. The traffic management layout will be similar to that in place at present, but on the other side of road. A footpath will be open on the southbound side for pedestrian access.
